OFFERS EDUCATION AND JOB OPPORTUNITIES TO MALAYSIAN YOUTHS



The inaugural graduation ceremony of MCDONALD'S Vocational Apprenticeship Programme celebrates trainees who can immediately kickstart their careers at McDonald's Malaysia

McDonald's Malaysia held its first graduation ceremony for youths who have successfully completed their training under the McDonald's Vocational Apprenticeship Programme. Approximately 50 youths were celebrated at a graduation ceremony held at the new McDonald's Vocational Academy located at McDonald's Mutiara Damansara Drive-Thru restaurant.

McDonald's Vocational Apprenticeship Programme is an 18-month industry-oriented training programme which combines 70 percent of practical training in McDonald's restaurants and 30 percent of theoretical lessons in the classroom. This programme is a collaboration between McDonald's Malaysia and the Ministry of Human Resources Malaysia under the National Dual Training System (NDTS) introduced by the Ministry. Once these youths have completed their training, they will be awarded the Malaysian Skills Certificate Level 3 (SKM) accredited by the Ministry of Human Resources, and will be qualified for employment at McDonald's restaurants or anywhere else within the food service industry in the country.

McDonald's Vocational Apprenticeship Programme was introduced in 2018, and to date, more than 1,200 youths throughout the country have cumulatively participated and are participating in the programme. McDonald's Malaysia is optimistic of reaching its target of 5,000 apprentices by the end of this year.

Dato' Amir Omar, Secretary General of Ministry of Human Resources was present at the graduation ceremony.

Youths participating in this programme are fully sponsored by McDonald's Malaysia, which includes a monthly allowance of RM1,200, accommodation, medical and insurance benefits, as well as free meals. In total, McDonald's Malaysia spends RM30,000 on each apprentice.

With over 14,000 employees nationwide, McDonald's Malaysia prioritises talent and skills development among its workforce. In addition to the McDonald's Vocational Apprenticeship Programme, the quick service restaurant operator has also introduced other talent development initiatives such as the McDonald's Management Apprenticeship Programme and the partnership with Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM) for the university's MBA programme.

ENHANCING SLEEP FOR CHILDREN IN NEED

IN MALAYSIA, there are over 60,000 children living in child care institutions. Many young boys and girls have been living in orphanages or shelters homes for as long as they can remember, and life for them hasn't always been easy. Getha continues its social aid through various initiatives with the donation of 75 mattresses to three shelter homes.

Getha's delivery team visited three homes. The first destination was Rainbow Home, a multi-racial home determined to provide these scarred children with love and hope. This shelter home takes care of 26 less fortunate children from the age of 3 to 18 years. Like all shelters, at the age of 18, children are then guided into a new life outside of the shelter. Getha donated 30 mattresses to this shelter, with a hope to make their sleep routine much more comfortable.

Next, Getha stopped at Shelter Home for Children. This organisation was created to rescue and protect children from traumatic families or situations, and nurture them into smart and brave members of society. Shelter Home houses boys and

girls from 4 to 12 years old, children above 12 years old move on to one of the other shelter homes. Getha sent 20 mattresses to this shelter for the continuous nurture and growth of these young children.

The last shelter Getha visited is Shepherds Centre Foundation. The team at this home is helping rejected individuals gain self-confidence and a sense of belonging. Getha donates 25 mattresses to non-school going boys from the age of 13 to 16 years old. These boys are taking up a vocational course to learn useful skills for future jobs, such as fishing, basic wiring, and about automobiles. This shelter cultivates these young boys to have valuable skills, while allowing them to explore what they like, and uncover hidden talents!

Getha has made other contributions to society, such as sponsoring orangutans in Zoo Negara, donating 1,000 pairs of black school shoes to children and providing help in a soup kitchen. The aim with all of these activities is to benefit the wellbeing of the environment and society for a sustainable future for everyone.

Supporting The Environment CARGILL CARES AND WETLANDS INTERNATIONAL MALAYSIA - FORGING A NOBLE PARTNERSHIP



WETLANDS INTERNATIONAL MALAYSIA is an independent, not-for-profit, global organisation dedicated to the conservation, restoration and wise-use of wetlands in Malaysia and ASEAN countries. It is the only global NGO dedicated to the conservation and wise use of wetlands. It aims to increase visibility and relevance especially among the local communities, private and corporate sectors and the government which creates an enabling environment for it to work more effectively, make an impact and achieve its ultimate goals in wetlands conservation.

In 2016, Cargill Cares approached Wetlands International and expressed its interest to contribute more for the environment which will bring benefit to local communities. Since 1978, Cargill has been operating in Malaysia, and its corporate responsibility programmes have been focused on programmes related to nutrition, education and the environment. Over the years, Cargill has invested in local communities through economic development, partnerships and contributions. As part of giving back to the community, its employees volunteer in these programmes.

Over the last 4 years, Wetlands International and Cargill have been in partnership with a goal to conserve and rehabilitate the wetlands of Malaysia. In this partnership, Wetlands International has conducted wetland awareness talks for Cargill employees from three of their different factories located at Butterworth, Westport and Malacca. Apart from that, replanting activities at various mangrove forests have been organised for its employees.

Mangrove forests are an important feature of marine ecosystem. As part of Wetlands International's effort to rehabilitate degraded mangrove ecosystem, we work closely with one of the fishermen groups named PIFWA (Penang Inshore Fishermen's Welfare Organisation) which was set up since 1997. They have been involved in and are dedicated to mangrove restoration to reverse the impact of mangrove degradation on their livelihood. Hence, it is timely for their teaming up and rehabilitation of the degraded mangrove forests.

Over the years, Cargill has helped replant more than 3,500 of mangrove seedlings and 1,000 of peat swamp seedlings. Apart from the partnership with PIFWA, Cargill also organised replanting activities at degraded sites such as Hulu Selangor, Kuala Sepang and Pantai Remis with Forestry Department through Wetlands International. Through the joint efforts, Cargill has contributed in reducing the impact of climate change and improving the livelihoods of local fishermen. Recently, Cargill in partnership with Wetland International took part in a clean-up activity at Tanjung Tuan which has a rich and diverse population of flora and fauna and is known as the ideal 'pit-stop' for migratory birds. The programme was later followed by a team building activity which included interactive games related to the wetlands.



Be A Volunteer & Meet Welfare Needs KECHARA SOUP KITCHEN GIVES A SECOND CHANCE TO THE HOMELESS AND FORGOTTEN

HUNGER Knows No Barriers – aptly describes Kechara Soup Kitchen, a not-for-profit and NGO established in 2008, that provides food, basic medical services, eye check, haircut, clothes to the homeless and urban poor regardless of race and creed; there is always someone to listen to their problems and offer advice. Kechara's no-discriminatory attitude also extends to their volunteers who come from all walks of life, motivated by the common goal of helping others. They work towards reducing homelessness by reuniting the homeless with their families, getting their lost documents replaced, rehoming and finding them jobs.

Their direct contact with those who live a 'street existence' has been invaluable in gaining their trust and gathering information on their needs. As a result of these observations, Kechara has established a plan to address not just the symptoms (hunger) but also the causes (urban poverty and a disconnection with society). Those stricken by poverty are not in that situation by choice. They do not want charity but they need inspiration.

KSK volunteers have discovered that there are people willing to re-enter society if given the opportunity – they just need to be shown the way. The state of being poor is not limited to just the physical aspects in life. It is not just about having no money, no food to eat, no shelter to call home and being denied of the opportunities that allow them to live decently. It goes beyond the physical and tangible context.

However, it is not the poverty or even the hunger that destroys their will to survive. It is the loss of hope, that sinking feeling that they have been forgotten, rejected and left behind by the community they belong to. When they lose hope, they also lose the fight to live on. When their lives reach this point, they allow themselves to descend into sub-human living conditions. These are the ones who have lost all hope and have resigned from life altogether.

From distributing food to the homeless, they have grown to collect surplus food from hypermarkets, wet markets, hotels, bakeries. These are given to the urban poor and to other charitable organisations instead of landing in the dumps. Donated dry foods are stored in their food bank premises and distributed to the poor before the product expiry date. Also, in their premises, single mothers and at-risk mothers are taught skill sets, enabling them to earn money and provide for their families.

Kechara Soup Kitchen strives to reduce homelessness, food wastage and poverty thus leading to a nation of cleaner environment and a better quality of life for the less privileged community.





EPIC HOMES began in 2010 from a once-off infrastructure project in an Orang Asli village. After coming across a home on the verge of collapse, the founding team discovered the family had been living in such conditions for over two years.

Building a home seemed like the obvious solution, but they also wanted to address the deeper challenges the community faced in a sustainable way while enabling the community to actively participate in the process. Inspired by Lego and Ikea, the team



looked to create a model where anyone could come together and do amazing things, like building a home. They also wanted to cultivate a way for people to meaningfully build relationships as a means to champion long-term community development.

In October 2010, the first Epic Home was completed. The Epic Homes build system is designed around the idea that a quality home can be built with just 30 people in 3 days in a safe, fun, and meaningful way. They have been supported by companies such as General Electric, Sunway Construction, and Prudential.

Since 2010, Epic Homes have been able to mobilise over 6000 contributors, to 16 villages in 5 states, providing over 159 families with homes. Despite all they have accomplished in the past 10 years, they are still eager to serve the 10,000 Orang Asli families still requiring a safe place to call home.

Their proudest achievement is the facilitation of relationships between people from all walks of life, with new initiatives being born as a result of the relationships formed between both volunteers and home recipients. Epic Homes has now grown into a platform to cultivate cross-cultural partnerships with their process forming the foundation of new social initiatives (and even social enterprises!) which are supported as part of their Collective Impact Network.

The Epic Homes team has won various recognitions such as the Mohammad Ali Humanitarian Award, Malaysian Global Innovation and Creativity Centre (MaGIC) Amplify Awards: Chairman's Innovation Award & Community Enterprise of the Year 2017, SME Malaysian Social Entrepreneur of the Year 2017, Tatler Malaysia - Force For Good Award, The Edge Inspiring Young Leaders Award, among others.

Supporting The Child BACKGROUND OF RUMAH HOPE

A SANCTUARY for abused, neglected and under-privileged children.

Rumah Hope was started in 1994 as a social ministry of Good Hope Lutheran Church, ELCM in aid of 5 needy children and as a sanctuary for abused, neglected and under-privileged children between the ages of 5-17. The Home relies solely on public funding to maintain itself.

After 4 years, the Home moved from an old rented bungalow in Old Klang Road to a new purpose built home, Rumah Hope 1 on the large grounds of Good Hope Lutheran Church in Paramount Garden , PJ. The construction of the home was possible thanks to generous contributions in cash and kind namely from Evangelical Lutheran Church Malaysia , Khalid Aluminium Industries Sdn Bhd, NGO's the general public and various corporate bodies. Rumah Hope 2, a second block was opened on 10th October 2006 on the same church grounds. Rumah Hope 1 and Rumah Hope 2 will be able to house a maximum of 70 children. The Home is registered with Registrar of Societies is also registered with the Selangor Welfare Council and it has been granted Tax Exemption status by the Ministry of Finance.

SIME DARBY PLANTATION AND PARTNER MEME

DEUELOP THE WORLD'S FIRST MECHANISM TO RESOLUE HUMAN-ELEPHANT CONFLICT

Nottingham

YAYASAN SIME DARBY is funding RM8.11 million to support the 11-year research project.

The world's first publicly available human-elephant conflict (HEC) resolution mechanism is set to be developed, thanks to the partnership between academia, public and private sectors.

The science-backed mechanism in the form of standard operating procedures (SOP) will be made public by the end of this year and it champions co-existence between humans and the endangered species.

This is made possible by a collaboration between the Management and Ecology of Malaysian Elephants (MEME) project and Sime Darby Plantation (SDP).

MEME has been running since 2012 with support from Yayasan Sime Darby (YSD). YSD renewed its support for the project with a RM2.85 million commitment for three years from January 2020 until December 2022. The project's phase 3 launch is commemorated by a memorandum of understanding (MoU) signing between YSD and MEME at the University of Nottingham Malaysia (UNM).

The project's long-term goals are to increase capacitybuilding and tolerance among communities, smallholders and plantations; to promote human-elephant co-existence on a national scale; and to enhance the protection

of wild elephants and their habitats. The project also aims to empower relevant communities to increase tolerance towards elephants, as this will address the rising death toll of the endangered species in Malaysia.

Teresa Kok, Minister of Primary Industries who was present at the launch lauded the initiative and said it addresses the rising HEC incidences among villagers, plantation workers and the elephants.

YSD Governing Council Member, Mohamad Helmy Othman Basha said the SOP is being developed to form part of SDP's Human-Wildlife Resolution policy under its Responsible Agriculture Charter (RAC). He announced that the SOP is set to be implemented across all SDP estates before the end of 2020.

"In the long run, this undertaking will empower plantations to understand human-elephant conflict patterns in their own area and enable adaptive management standards, as elephant behaviour and the nature of the human-elephant conflict may differ from one place to another.

"Once completed, the standard operating procedure will be made accessible to all relevant industries," said Helmy who is also the Group Managing Director of Sime Darby Plantation.

MEME was established since 2011 as a joint research project between the University of Nottingham Malaysia and the Department of Wildlife and National Parks (PERHILITAN), with the aim to move towards evidence-based management and conservation of wild elephants in Peninsular Malaysia.

Dr Wong Ee Phin, the Principal Investigator for MEME said wild elephants require large roaming areas and a big portion of their habitat lies outside of protected areas. "In Peninsular

Malaysia's landscape where we still have elephants and humans living together, two-thirds are experiencing conflict."

"The continued support from YSD has allowed MEME to continue our momentum, to move from knowledge generation to implementation on the ground. We need to work together with agriculture communities to see how we can manage the conflict to a tolerable level that allow coexistence for long-term," she said.

KENANGA INVESTMENT BANK BERHAD has always been actively working on and helping out in various forms of CSR activities and initiatives. In a recent interview with Chuah Sze Phing, Head of Group Marketing & Communications, Kenanga is responding to increased social and community needs especially in the COVID-19 environment, the Bank today launched The HumanKIND Project to empower Malaysian social enterprises working with marginalised communities, particularly the disabled and differently abled. The Project will commence with enhanced support for the Bank's long-standing social enterprise partner, Dialogue Includes All, which runs Café Includes, an independent café in Petaling Jaya operated by a team of people with disabilities including those with low vision, the physically challenged, hearing-impaired, autistic and others.

Kenanga Investment Bank Berhad was established 50 years ago in 1973 by its Founder and Adviser, YM Tan Sri Dato' Paduka Tengku Noor Zakiah Tengku Ismail. Despite being 94 years of age, she is still very active in the company. "Besides being an entrepreneur, she was also a philanthropist

with a passion to make changes for the better in the lives of others," says Chuah Sze Phing.

Tan Sri Tengku Noor Zakiah became a fashion designer in the 1950s and 1960s and would hold fashion shows with the expatriate and air force community to raise funds for charitable causes. "During the Asian financial crisis in the 1990s, Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad had a government relief fund and she led the Stockbroking Association with Kenanga at the forefront and successfully raised a huge sum of money to contribute to the fund," says Chuah.

"We are actively supporting an organisation called "Dialogue Includes All" (DIA), formerly known as "Dialogue in the Dark". The Social Enterprise is operated by DID MY Academy Sdn Bhd and licensed by Dialogue Social Enterprise GmbH since September 2012, an international group of social enterprises which started in Germany," says Chuah excitedly. "Café Includes is an initiative under (DIA), it is spearheaded by disabled activist Stevens Chan and established in 2018. The cafe is an independent café in Petaling Jaya operated by a team of people with disabilities (PWDs)."





Kenanga's campaign, "The HumanKINDProject" will be launched to empower Malaysian social enterprises working with marginalised communities. "The central philosophy of the Project is our shared humanity. In a time of distancing and isolation, it is all the more important that we find ways to reconnect and amplify the essential qualities that make us human, which is kindness, compassion and empathy," says Chuah.

"We are supporting Café Includes as through the café, DIA seeks to provide PWDs training in food and beverage handling and preparation as well as the necessary business and management expertise required to run an independent and financially sustainable enterprise. Before the lockdown, the organisation held activities such as The Dark Experience Centre tours for fundraising, which is an experiential hourlong tour, where visitors are led by blind guides in groups through specially constructed dark rooms," says Chuah. "In 2019, they started "Art Includes", an arts festival for persons with disabilities, with a mission to foster, cultivate and harness mindsets on inclusions despite diversities through arts and music. DIA also provides free tuition to the blind and deaf children as well as offers training to disabled youths in economic enabling programmes. Today, the academy also has schools for urban farming, telemarketing, hosting virtual tuition and a café, all introduced to help People with disabilities to become entrepreneurs."

"We provided some funds for DIA to start the café. It is now relocated at Jalan Gasing in Petaling Jaya. We would like to promote the café to the public to make a social impact so we would like to encourage the public to try out the meals at Café Includes. The Bank will sponsor 100 customer orders (with a maximum of RM20) made to the Café, every Friday starting on 19th February. These orders may be placed via the Grab food delivery service, redeemable with the promotional code "HumanKIND"," says Chuah. "Kenanga will also work with other frontline non-government organisations that assist marginalised B40 groups and the homeless, to ensure some of these orders reach others who are in need and may not have access to online ordering systems."

Marginalised communities in Malaysia face difficulties on many levels, including access to mainstream services and facilities and these difficulties have become a lot more urgent after more than a year of intermittent movement control. Kenanga has been supporting DIA since its inception in 2012. With around 45 members to support, they require 100 orders a day to break-even, and they hope corporates and individuals alike will join them in this move to help sustain their enterprise.

"We would like to invite everyone to join us in supporting Café Includes, and other social enterprises out there. Your everyday purchases could be used to help transform lives in a most positive way," says Chuah. "Kenanga has a long history of social responsibility interventions led by its founder, ranging from fundraising, community outreach to corporate social responsibility. The HumanKIND Project builds on this tradition as a focal point of Kenanga's philanthropic efforts, which the Bank hopes will act as a catalyst for wider social action. Therefore, we would like to call on corporations and individuals to join in a broad social movement to push forward the ethos of The HumanKIND Project by supporting social enterprises as the best agents of change to empower, inspire and assist those who are most in need."

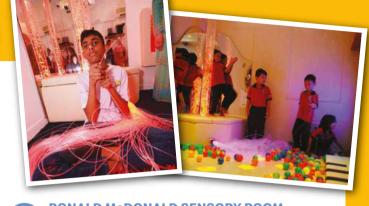
Ronald McDonald House Charities

RONALD McDONALD HOUSE Keeping Families Close

When your child is sick, you would want the best care possible even if it is hundreds or thousands of miles away. The Ronald McDonald House provides a place for families to call home. which allows them to stay close by their hospitalised child, at little to no cost. Currently, there are two Ronald McDonald Houses (RMH) in Malaysia. The first house was built in 1990 at Hospital Canselor Tuanku Muhriz, Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia in Cheras, Kuala Lumpur and another RMH is located in Hospital Universiti Sains Malaysia at Kubang Kerian, Kelantan.



RONALD McDONALD SENSORY ROOM Building a network of sensory therapy facilities for children with special needs

RMHC Malaysia has established 34 Ronald McDonald Sensory Rooms at various schools and centers for children with special needs, the largest network of sensory therapy facilities in Malaysia. Ronald McDonald Sensory Rooms are equipped with multi-sensory equipment to help children with learning difficulties, developmental disabilities or sensory impairments. A total of RM3.3 million has been raised for this program that provides therapy to more than 4,000 children every year.



RMHC Malaysia has spent more than RM5.2 million to help children born with cleft lip and palate to undergo corrective surgeries. Since the inception of the "Gift of Smile" program, more than 700 children have undergone corrective surgeries

with full financial support.



Building Confidence in Seeking Education

Since 2017, RMHC Malaysia has distributed more than 55,000 'Back-to-School' packs to primary schools nationwide. The program aims to provide children from low-income families with basic school necessities in efforts to build their confidence and ease the financial burden of families.
